Upcoming In-Person & Online Courses in 2022-2023

December 12-13, 2022 Current Concepts in Medication Therapy

As primary care providers, you are constantly encountering a dizzying array of medication options and patient questions regarding advertised medications. You are responsible for managing complex medication regimens including treatments we may not be intimately familiar with. In addition, safety concerns and new indications for old medications arise regularly. In order to help primary care providers keep up-to-date on these issues, we have organized this course on medication therapy. (*Live Webinar*)

February 9-10, 2023 Endocrinology Update for Primary Care

This is a comprehensive 1.5-day course on principles of endocrinology and diabetes geared toward primary care providers. There is an ongoing immense need for education in these areas as there have been vast changes in the field of endocrinology over the past decade. Primary care providers often are faced with diagnosing many endocrine conditions such as thyroid disorders, treatment of calcium disorders, osteoporosis as well as diabetes and obesity. This course aims to provide a broad update on current strategies in endocrine disease management. (*In-person, University of Washington Tower Auditorium, UW Campus, Seattle, WA*)

March 16-17, 2023 Women's Health Care Update

This conference is an annual update for women's health care providers on current topics relevant to women's health. The topics are selected from previous course attendee suggestions, areas with substantial change, and controversial subjects where medical opinions may differ. The purpose is to provide a clinical update for providers who care for women in an outpatient setting. The format is a series of short lectures followed by question-and-answer sessions. March 18, 2023 4th Anesthesia & Obstetrics Joint Conference: What Happened to You? Realize, Recognize, Respond, and Resist Re-Traumatization in Labor and Delivery

This conference will provide obstetric, family medicine, and anesthesia providers with up-to-date information in several areas with recent new developments in obstetric care, including an introduction in trauma-informed care, exploring cases in small group settings, introducing management skills to identify patients at risk, and addressing acute stress responses. In simulation sessions, participants will be able to share personal viewpoints, learn self-care strategies and gather valuable take-home messages. (*Live, University of Washington South Lake Union, Seattle, WA*)

April 10-14, 2023 40th Annual Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation Review Course

This innovative and interactive course is a comprehensive review for physicians preparing for ABPM&R Part 1 or 2 Board Certification or re-certification examinations. Designed to maximize virtual learning by providing content in a variety of formats, the curriculum is divided into content modules taught by the University of Washington and guest faculty with content expertise. Live sessions will allow learners to engage with the experts with ample opportunity to ask questions. We are also offering an optional practice oral board session that is consistently rated as one of the most highly useful and enjoyable sessions. Online via Live Webinar and Prerecorded Content. April 28, 2023 Clinical Cardiology Pearls for Primary Care

This course is tailored for a primary care audience and is intended to provide practical, up-to-date information on commonly encountered cardiovascular diseases. World-class faculty from the University of Washington School of Medicine will teach participants using case-based lectures and an audience response system to encourage interactive dialogue. Recent guidelines for hypertension, cholesterol management, and diabetes will be reviewed. (*Online Via Live Webinar*)
