# Topic Engagement Meetings Clinical Assessment Workgroup - Phase 2: Design

## Background

On March 7, 2022, the UWSOM Curriculum Committee, acting upon the recommendations of the Program Evaluation and Assessment Committee (PEAC) and feedback from the Patient Care Committee, charged a workgroup with exploring strategies for addressing inequities in grading within the clinical phases of the medical student curriculum. The first phase of this workgroup ultimately recommended that all required clerkships be converted to pass/fail grading, with the additional recommendation that the clinical assessment system be reworked with a Competency-Based Medical Education (CBME) focus, utilizing entrustable professional activities (EPAs) as a workplace-based assessment method. Those recommendations have been unanimously approved by UWSOM Curriculum governance committees and the Faculty Council on Academic Affairs (FCAA).

This project encompasses four phases of work:

## Phase 2 Workgroup Structure

Phase 2 of the Clinical Assessment Workgroup (the *Design Phase*) is scheduled to be completed by December 2024 and includes members of the first workgroup as well as additional stakeholders who will be impacted by changes to clinical assessment in required clerkships. This phase of the workgroup will define the components of the clinical assessment system for required clerkships, including:

- A comprehensive set of milestones based on CLOOM's revised program objectives
- A set of longitudinally-assessed EPAs, including their use, timing, and any required revisions to clerkship curriculum
- The structure and role of clinical competency committees
- Requirements for and intended use of the technology support systems necessary for monitoring student progress across the curriculum
- A model for coaching to competencies
- A guide for determining clerkship grades, including suggested criteria and a standardized decision-making process
- Requirements for faculty development around CBME, EPAs, and the new clinical assessment system
- A strategy for dealing with downstream effects on APCs and electives

It will also develop an implementation strategy for instituting pass/fail grading that aligns with planned changes to the clinical assessment system.

Eight working groups will be selected to facilitate broad participation and collaboration across the curriculum's key stakeholder groups. Each working group, charged with one of the strategic priorities identified above, will receive terms of reference that define their purpose, mandate, timeline, and deliverables. The mandate of these working groups is centered on reviewing the medical education research literature and/ or completing an environmental scan and then developing recommendations for review by the larger workgroup. Recommendations will then be presented to the Curriculum Committee and FCAA for approval.

### Phase 2 Meeting Schedule

Five meetings of the full workgroup, as well as additional meetings as needed between members of subgroups, are planned for the upcoming year (2024):
