- A-synchronous modules on topics such as social determinants of health, health equity, health disparities, current and emerging health issues, and behavioral health
- Events to network with other students and area health professionals
- An opportunity to develop skills relevant for today's rural and underserved healthcare
- Stipends (minimum \$500, maximum \$1000)

REQUIREMENTS

- Complete Asynchronous modules
- Complete elective clinical training such as the UWSOM RUOP or UWSOD RIDE
- Mentor younger students interested in healthcare careers
- Complete a research project on a community health topic
